Parental Responsibility:

The concept of parental responsibility replaces the old idea of one or both parents having custody of a child. In the Children Act 2004 it is defined as “all the rights, duties, powers and responsibilities which a parent has for a child” such as providing a home, feeding and clothing, providing protection and security and so forth. Mothers always have parental responsibility and fathers automatically have it if they are married to the mother at the time of the child's birth, but not otherwise. However, an unmarried father may acquire parental responsibility in a number of different ways, for example by being named on the birth certificate.
